

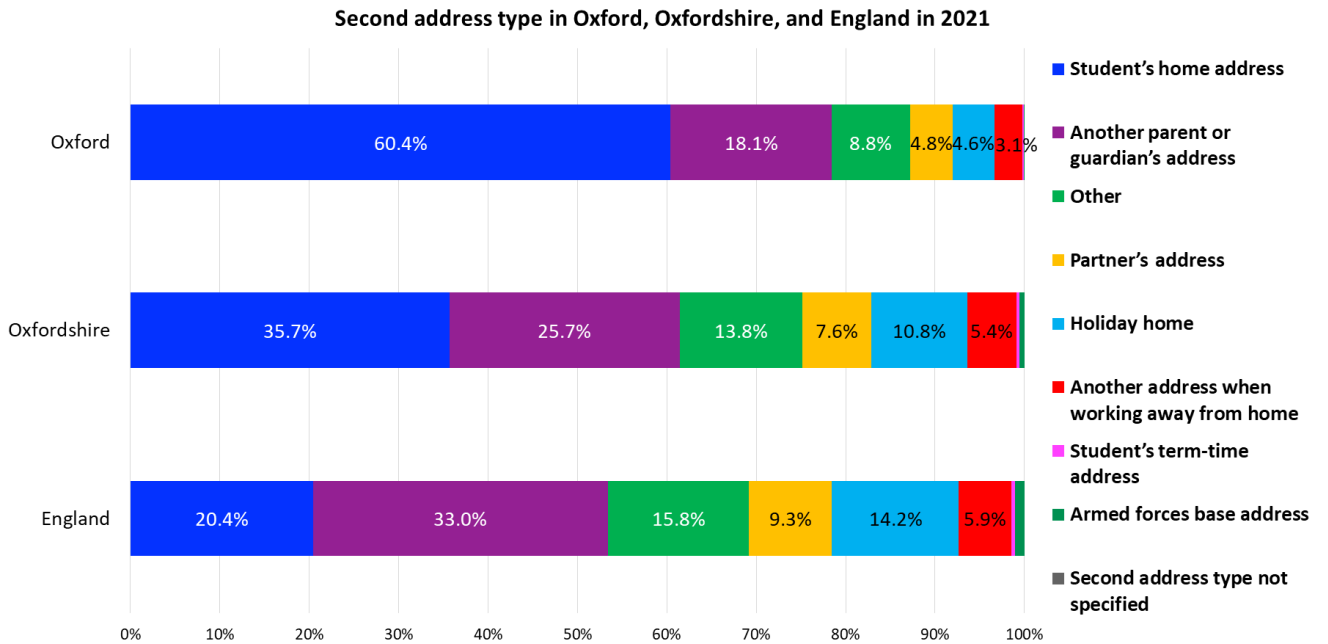
Housing in Oxford – Second address and communal establishments.

As part of the latest Census 2021 release on housing, the ONS has made available data on second address, communal establishments, and characteristics of the current housing stock in Oxford. The Business Intelligence Unit (BIU) has produced a series of summary reports to cover all the indicators included in this topic release. This summary report will explore the latest figures on second addresses and communal establishments in Oxford. Key findings:

- The second address indicator shows that 20.5% of the respondents in Oxford have a second address. This represents a 1.1% increase compared to the 2011 Census.
- Of those residents who have a second address, 76.2% have it within the UK, and 23.8% outside the UK. This represents a 4.6% decrease in second addresses outside the UK.
- Second address classification shows that the largest percentage of second addresses was made up of *Students home address* (60.4%), this is much higher than both the county (35.7%) and national (20.4%) averages.
- The second largest group was *Another parent or guardian's address* (18.1%), followed by *Other* (8.8%).
- Data on communal establishments by age and sex showed that the largest group were *residents* (97.7%). This is higher than both county (96.9%) and national (96.1%) averages. Other groups residents in communal establishments in Oxford were *Staff or owner* (1.1%), *Family member or partner of staff or owner* (0.2%) or someone *Staying temporarily (no usual UK address)* (1.0%).
- Of those who are residents, the largest group was residents aged 16-24 years with 78.9% (38.0% male and 40.9% female). This is 2.6% higher than the previous Census figures.
- The second largest group was residents aged 25-34 years with 12.0% (6.3% male and 5.8% female). This has recorded a 0.5% decrease compared to the previous Census.
- In terms of communal establishments management and type, the largest proportion of residents was recorded in *Other establishment* (95.6%), this is much higher than both Oxfordshire and England at 86.0% and 62.1% respectively.
- Within the category *Other establishment*, the largest subcategory was *Education* with 94.8% of all usual residents in this type of communal establishments. This is much higher than Oxfordshire and England at 73.7% and 45.9% respectively.
- The second largest category was *Medical and Care establishment* (2.8%) and within this category the largest sub-group was *Care home with nursing* (1.4%), and *Care home without nursing* (1.1%).

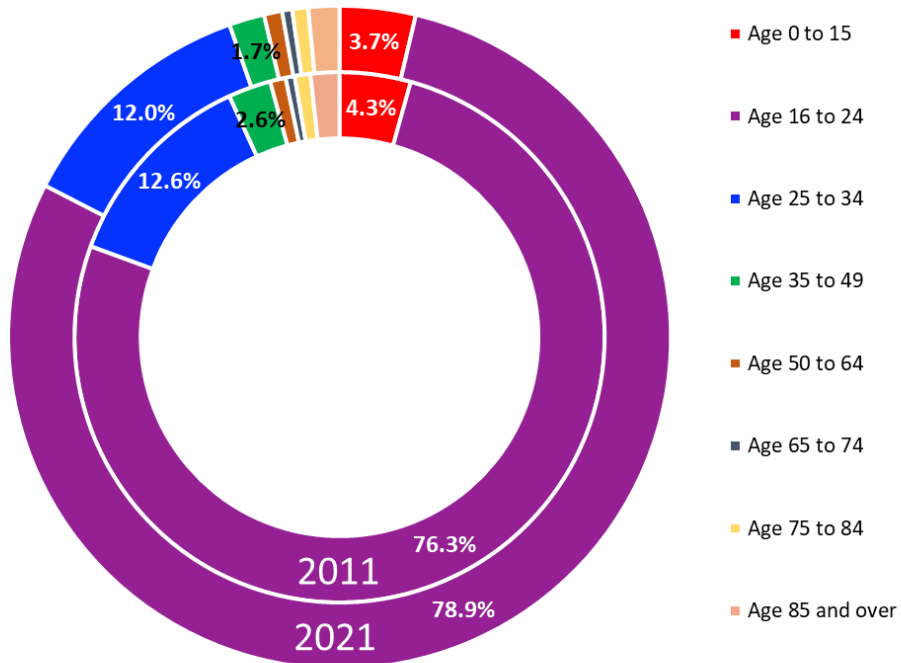
Figure 1. Second address type in Oxford, Oxfordshire, and England in 2021.
