History

Florence Park was opened in 1934 after the land was presented to the City of Oxford by Councillor FE Moss.

The land was given to the City in memory of his sister, Florence, whose name it bears.

A plaque to celebrate this is displayed in the park.

Park Rangers

Getting there

There are several pedestrian access points, Rymers Lane, Florence Park Road, and Campbell Road

Bus

- Buses run to and from the city and local areas.
- [Oxford Bus Company](#) routes 3A or 5 stop approx 5 minutes walk away
 - [Stagecoach](#) route 16 and 16A, stop approx 1 minute walk away
 - Heyfordian, route 103 or 104

Car

There is street parking available in Rymers Lane or in the Multi-storey car park at Templar's Square Shopping Centre.

Bike

There are several local and national cycle tracks that bring you near the park.
